### Transferring into Villanova Part-Time Studies

Credits from any regionally accredited college or university will be given serious consideration. You may transfer up to 60 credits/20 courses toward your Villanova bachelor's degree.

### Other Ways to Earn Credit

Through the College of Arts & Sciences' Credit by Examination program, you can pass a departmental exam, satisfy the program's requirements and earn the credits. Another way to earn credit is through the College Level Examination Program (CLEP) or Advanced Placement (AP) exams. If you are enrolled in a degree program in the College of Arts & Sciences, you can participate in an internship and earn credit for learning at your place of employment.

### Financial Help is Here

### Part-Time Studies Community College Scholars Program

Transfer students from Community College of Philadelphia, Delaware County Community College and Montgomery County Community College who are accepted as matriculating students into the Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies degree program under the guidelines of existing transfer agreements may be eligible for a 20% tuition reduction for each course taken at Villanova.

### Phi Theta Kappa Scholarships for New Part-Time Studies Students
