Award Description

The intent of the Public Interest Section *Anita Santos-Singh Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion Summer Scholarship* is to support a more inclusive and diverse cohort of public interest summer interns in Philadelphia.

Eligible Candidates

- Law students from any of the following law schools: Drexel University Thomas R. Kline School of Law, The University of Pennsylvania Carey Law School, Rutgers Law School (Camden location), Temple University James E. Beasley School of Law, Villanova University Charles Widger School of Law, Widener University Delaware Law School
- Law students who are intending to work in unpaid positions for ten weeks in the summer in an established 501 (c)(3) located within the city limits of Philadelphia, PA
- Law students receiving less than \$10,000 of funding for their summer public interest work
- Law students who are members of groups that are underrepresented in the legal profession

2024 Scholarship Amount: \$500

Selection Process

The selection committee will review all application materials, after which eligible students will be entered into a lottery. Awardee will be chosen at random.

Application Process

Interested students should submit, in one .pdf labelled Last Name _ First Name, the following documents in the order listed below:

- personal statement (300 words) explaining how applicant is a member of a group/groups that is/are underrepresented in the legal profession and how applicant will add to the diversity of the summer legal intern cohort
- amount of summer funding already received
- resume
- copy of employment letter or email

The Justinian Foundation Scholarship Application

The Justinian Foundation is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization founded in 1996. The charitable arm of The Justinian Society (1935), the Foundation's sole purpose is to provide financial assistance to law students currently enrolled in an accredited law school in a program of study leading to a juris doctor degree. Scholarship candidates must be admitted to an accredited law school within a one hundred (100) mile radius of the City of Philadelphia and must be entering, at a minimum, their second year; or must meet the requirements for specific scholarships.

In addition to our general scholarships, our named scholarships include the Richard F. Furia, Esquire Scholarship is granted to the winner of an essay contest with a focus on advocating against stereotyping and defamation. (See separate flyer submission details.)

The Justinian Foundation Scholarship Eligibility

Scholarship eligibility requires applicants to:

- 1. Be a member in good standing of a Philadelphia-area The Justinian Society Law School Chapter for the Foundation Scholarship;
- 2. Have Italian parents or grandparents;
- 3. Have achieved excellence in academic studies;
- 4. Have a record of service to their school and/or community;
- 5. Be a person of the highest integrity who shows a sincere desire to be of service to his or her fellow human beings;
- 6. Has exhibited the potential to be a credit to the profession of law;
- 7. Be a current second-year law student preparing for graduation in the third year for the Foundation Scholarship; and
- 8. Demonstrate financial need to complete the third year for The Foundation Scholarship.

Furia, Esq., Co-founder of The Justinian Foundation, followed in his father, the Honorable Edward W. Furia's footsteps, both having served as chancellors of The Justinian Society. Before Richard's death in 2011, he requested that memorial donations be sent to The Justinian Foundation. Richard was very active in the Society and the Orders of the Sons of Italy in America Commission for Social Justice, fighting against stereotypes that sought to disenfranchise Italian-Americans. To that end, The Justinian Foundation of Philadelphia invites any law school student currently in his/her second year to submit a 750 – 1,000-word essay answering:

As an attorney, what will you do to fight against stereotyping and defamation of Italian-Americans and people of all races, religions and cultures in general?

The scholarship recipient will be invited to The Justinian Society and Foundation luncheon on June 13, 2024, to accept the scholarship payable to the recipient's law school for his/her third year.
