# **News and Updates**

Ambassador Charles A. Heimbold Jr. May 27, 1933 - August 20, 2004

We mourn the passing of one of our great benefactors, Charles A. Heimbold, Jr. Our Heimbold Chair of Irish Studies was inaugurated in 2000 by Seamus Heaney and Peter Fallon. Since then, the Heimbold Chair has brought 25 Irish writers into our classrooms, allowing hundreds of our students the chance to study with Ireland's finest literary voices.

Charles Heimbold, Jr. grew up in working-class neighborhood in Newark NJ, the eldest of six brothers. He attended Villanova University, where he studied engineering, and served three years in the Navy, with his final tour of duty on the destroyer, the USS Gainard. During a summer law school program at The Hague in the Netherlands he met a Swedish fashion designer, Monika Barkvall. She came to the U.S. in 1960, and they married two years later and started their family. In 1963, he joined the law department at Bristol-Myers Squibb Company, eventually being named company President in 1992, Chief Executive Officer in 1994 and Chairman of the Board in 1995.

Charles was nominated to become U.S. Ambassador to Sweden in 2001. Inspired by the granddaughter's love of Irish literature, the Heimbolds endowed the Heimbold Chair of Irish Studies. They also endowed a chair for Law and Economics at the University of Pennsylvania and sponsored a new Visual Arts Center at Sarah Lawrence College. Through the Heimbold Family Foundation, the Heimbolds have supported the American Scandinavian Foundation, among other organizations.



Charles Heimbold quoted a Swedish proverb in his memoir, an approach to life that he tried to honor: "Fear less, hope more, eat less, chew more, whine less, breathe more, talk less, say more, hate less, love more and all good things are yours."

#### Paid Internship at the Jackie Clarke Museum and Library in Ballina, Co. Mayo

#### Summer Dublin EYE (Early Years' Experience) Internship

The Summer Dublin EYE provides first-year Villanova students the unique opportunity to explore and challenge their career assumptions through a 3-credit international work experience in Dublin, Ireland, while also introducing them to the various forms of expressions of traditional and contemporary Irish identity and culture through a 3-credit course on literature, music, and the arts. **Deadline: February 15, 2025** 

#### Summer Studio in Irish Theater

From the studio to the stage, graduate students will study the workings and history







of Ireland's world-class national theatre while developing their own theatre skills, knowledge, and practice. Student work will culminate in a showing of final work in the Lir, Ireland's National Academy of Dramatic Art and guided by Abbey Theatre professionals.

#### Summer Irish Studies in Galway

The Villanova Irish Studies Summer Program will introduce students to Ireland's history, literature, society and archaeology through a 10-day Orientation in Dublin, and the Aran Islands, and one month of coursework at the National University of Ireland, Galway Summer School in Irish Studies.

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## February 13 - 15: The North American Premier of LOST LEAR



Lost Lear is an innovative and powerful contemporary rewrite of Shakespeare's play told from the point of view of Joy, a retired actor with dementia, who is living in an old memory of rehearsing "King Lear." The staff of the nursing home where Joy lives facilitate her care by acting out her happy memories. Joy's delicately maintained reality is upended by the arrival of her estranged son who, being cast as Cordelia, must find a way to speak his piece from within the limited role he is given. Using puppetry, projection and live video effects, the audience are landed in Joy's world as

layers of her past and present, fiction and reality, overlap and distort. 'Lost Lear' is a thought-provoking meditation on memory, artifice and the possibility of communicating across the chasms between us. (View <u>trailer</u>)

Emma DeSouza is a journalist, award-winning campaigner, and peace activist who changed UK law in a landmark human rights case relating to the Good Friday Agreement. She is the Founder and Cofacilitator of deliberative democracy platform The Civic Initiative, Director of the Northern Ireland Emerging Leaders Program at the National Committee on American Foreign Policy in New York, and a transatlantic adviser on peace processes and civic

innovation.

<u>Stephen Sexton</u> is an award-winning Northern Irish poet and lecturer at the renowned Seamus Heaney Centre for Poetry at Queen's University Belfast. His pamphlet of poems Oils was the 2014 Poetry Book Society's Winter Pamphlet . He is the author of two books of



poems – If All the World and Love Were Young, published in 2019 and Cheryl's Destinies, published in 2021. He is a recipient of multiple awards, which include winning the 2016 National Poetry Competition, the 2018 Eric Gregory Award, the Forward Prize for Best First Collection and the Shine / Strong Award for Best First Collection in 2019, the American Academy of Arts and Letters' E. M. Forster Award and the Rooney Prize for Irish Literature in 2020.

Stephen has been teaching creative writing at the Seamus Heaney Centre for six years. The Centre opened in 2004 and has a legacy that carries a sense of an ethical responsibility on the writer's part. When teaching poetry and poetics, Sexton emphasizes the responsibility of the language and the way that this shared resource is used as a component of community.


