Practical Writing	2-3		5000 level courses.  Note: A clinic satisfies one practical writing requirement and counts towards the experiential learning requirement. In other words, a clinic "double counts" towards one practical writing course and experiential learning.
Seminar/Research Paper or 2 <sup>nd</sup> Practical Writing Course	2-3		5000 level courses. Clinics do not satisfy the second practical writing requirement. If a student takes a clinic, they must also take either another PW course or a seminar/research paper. 6000 level courses are seminars; no more than 6 credits of Seminar/Research Paper will be counted towards credits needed for graduation. Participation on a Journal does not fulfill this requirement.
Experiential Learning	6		Must take 6 credits of experiential learning in a clinic or an externship. A clinic also satisfies the practical writing requirement; externships do NOT satisfy the practice writing requirement.  Concurrent enrollment prohibited: No student may take more than one experiential class (clinic or externship) in a single semester.  See website for more information on credit limitations.
