Shortlisted candidates will interview via Zoom on a later date in November. Submitting an internal application does not guarantee university endorsement.

- 3. Your transcript (a copy of your unofficial transcript is sufficient)

Please combine application items 1-3 into a <u>single PDF document</u> (titled "Last Name, First Name Truman Scholarship Application").
