 - Award description and year
- 6. Please include a 1000-word writing sample that discusses a previous research project. Your sample should include a description of the issue or problem, a discussion of the research methodology, and discussion of your findings; this may resemble a journal article in tone. When writing an essay on a past research experience, it is important to clearly discuss your contributions to the project and indicate the specific skills or expertise you developed.
