COMING TO CAMPUS



In this packet, you'll find a hang tag for your vehicle. It is important to bring this hang tag with you on Move-In Day and display it from your rearview mirror. Only vehicles displaying this hang tag will be permitted to access areas near residence halls. Only one hang tag is available per student, and only one vehicle will be permitted to access areas near residence halls. Please note that U-Hauls and other rental trucks will not fit into University parking garages, and the use of these vehicles for move-in purposes is discouraged.

You will encounter an increased amount of traffic and may experience waiting periods. We ask for your patience as we welcome 1,800 new students to campus.

ARRIVING AT YOUR RESIDENCE HALL

When you arrive at your residence hall, please unload your belongings on the sidewalk. After unloading, staff will direct the driver to a parking area while others in your party continue the move-in process. *To avoid congestion and delays, vehicles are not permitted to remain unattended at the residence halls.*

Once you've unloaded, check-in and pick up your Wildcard at the entrance of your residence hall. Your Wildcard will give you access to your room, and you may begin moving in! Please remember to dispose of recycling and trash according to the posted signs in your building. If you have any questions, Residence Life and Orientation staff members will be available to assist you.
