INVESTIGATION OCCURS

REVIEW, INVESTIGATION, AND RESOLUTION

The University will assist any Complainant or Respondent in understanding the formal complaint process outlined in the University's policy. There are several options available to resolve a report of sexual misconduct including informal and formal on campus resolution and/or off-campus processes. If a Complainant chooses not to file a formal complaint, supportive measures will remain available to them. The University must weigh the Complainant's choice against our obligation to provide a safe, non-discriminatory environment for all community members, including the Complainant.

RESOLUTION OPTIONS AND SUPPORTIVE MEASURES

- Complaints against non-law students will be resolved under the *Student Special Procedures Governing Sexual Misconduct Proceedings*.
- Complaints against law students will be resolved under the *Law Student Special Procedures Governing Sexual Misconduct Proceedings*.
- Complaints against employees will be resolved by the special procedures which apply to that employee (faculty or staff).
- Complaints by students against employees may not be resolved through informal resolution.
- The Sexual Assault Resource Coordinator (SARC), the Title IX Investigator, the Title IX Coordinator, Respondent Resource Coordinator and/or the Dean of Students Office can assist students with supportive measures such as: academic, housing, or other accommodations; referrals; and other needed support.
- Students who report sexual misconduct in good faith will not be subject to disciplinary action for their own personal consumption of alcohol or other drugs
- The University will promptly complete the administrative investigation and resolution of all reports.
