



## WHEN SOMEONE DISCLOSES SEXUAL VIOLENCE TO YOU

If someone discloses sexual violence to you:

### Step 1: Care

#### Care for the person

- Ensure that they are safe
- Provide non-judgmental support

### Step 2: Connect

#### Connect the person with resources

- Reporting Options
- Counseling and Support

### Step 3: Contact

#### Contact the Title IX Coordinator
