Investing in Future Villanovans

As an Augustinian Catholic institution, Villanova is called to educate people regardless of their socioeconomic status. This is the bedrock on which the University was built more than 180 years ago. Today, that foundational commitment is also shaping our future. Endowed scholarships help remove the financial barriers keeping high-achieving students from Villanova, creating an academic community rich in talent, diverse in background and enhanced by a wealth of perspectives. Currently, Villanova does not meet 100% of demonstrated financial need for undergraduate students. Villanova's goal in this campaign is to narrow the need gap by raising \$300 million for endowed scholarships, with a specific goal of \$25 million for FCN. Reaching this goal will make Villanova comparable to peer universities and will position FCN to attract and enroll the most academically gifted students from across the socioeconomic spectrum.

Nick Jubilee, a Nursing major, Villanova Diving team captain and BIG EAST 1-Meter Diving champion first experienced the power of Villanova's uniquely caring community when he received his scholarship package. "Not only did it make Villanova financially viable, but it told me that people believed in me and all I could do at Villanova."

That undercurrent of support—from faculty, coaches and friends—has set him up to excel. On top of a rigorous practice and competition schedule and coursework, Nick has taken on leadership roles in The 13%, a student group dedicated to improving the experience of Black student-athletes at Villanova; in the Multicultural Student Nurses Organization, which facilitates community connection for Nursing students of color; and as a Nursing Ambassador, sharing his experience with prospective Nursing students and families. Winner of the 2024 Villanova Black Alumni Student-Athlete Award for Outstanding Achievement, Nick recently served as a Susan D. Flynn Oncology Fellow at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia on the Bone Marrow Transplant and Oncology Units and held a summer research internship at the Johns Hopkins School of Public Health.

"I want to give back to the next generation of nurses," he says. "Especially for nurses of color, having a mentor who looks like you can make a big difference."

Bridgette M. Rice, PhD, MDiv, APRN, FAAN

Associate Dean for Research and Innovation Richard and Marianne Kreider Endowed Professor in Nursing for Vulnerable Populations

An award-winning and innovative researcher, Bridgette M. Rice, PhD, MDiv, APRN, FAAN, focuses her research portfolio on the promotion of health equity and reduction of health disparities in marginalized groups. She has secured more than \$6 million in funding to advance the understanding of individual, social and structural drivers of inequity with spatially driven, mixed-methods approaches to research. She is the founder and director of the Fitzpatrick

College of Nursing's Research for Equity and Justice Collective.

Dr. Rice is a sought-after speaker and national leader in promoting the critical role of nurses in research and innovation. Recently, Philadelphia's Science Center invited her to speak at its Scalable Solutions-Focused Think Tank on nursing and health care innovation; she also spoke at the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering and Medicine's workshop on "Addressing Workforce Challenges Across the Behavioral Health Continuum of Care." In addition, Dr. Rice delivered the keynote address for the Intensive Training Institute of the American Nurses Association/Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration Minority Fellowship Program.



Guy M. Weissinger II, PhD, MPhil, RN

Diane Foley Parrett Endowed Assistant Professor

Guy Weissinger, PhD, MPhil, RN, is recognized nationally and internationally for his work as a nurse scientist and an educator, specializing in the intersection between mental health and health systems to improve health outcomes.

Originally a therapist before becoming a nurse, Dr. Weissinger blends his clinical experience in emergency medicine, outpatient mental health, public health nursing and home care with a mixed-methods approach to research involving suicide prevention, adolescent mental health and the health care workforce. The National Institutes of Health has tapped him for his expertise

as a reviewer for a Healthcare and Health Disparities study section meeting. The Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario has also called on him to serve as co-chair of its expert panel for *Best Practice Guideline: Assessment and Care of Persons at Risk for Suicidal Ideation and Behaviour,* with the potential to influence policy and practice throughout Canada.


Key Campaign Initiatives

Simulation and Learning Resource Center

In the Simulation and Learning Resource Center (SLRC), Nursing students refine their ever-growing clinical skills in a state-of-thescience, safe, controlled and customizable environment.

Simulation is an essential and a versatile complement to the traditional clinical experiences of student nurses. Villanova's SLRC enables its learners to refine their nursing skills and clinical reasoning with repeated participation in simulated patient scenarios, improving their performance over time in this secure environment.

With advancements in technology, simulation continues to provide increasingly authentic experiences for nursing students. Virtual reality, for example, offers a deeply immersive level of realism. Integrating the College's simulation opportunities with the latest clinical learning and virtual or augmented reality will provide students with a variety of opportunities to practice and expand their skill sets. Reimagining the SLRC's clinical education space with enhanced integration of equipment and technology will ultimately



Center of Excellence in Nursing Workforce Development

A Center of Excellence in Nursing Workforce Development would place the College at the forefront in addressing the rapidly growing nursing workforce shortage in numerous areas such as elder care, oncology, health care innovation, research, elimination of health disparities and other critical areas. Developed in tandem with industry partners, the Center would improve the delivery of care by growing the pool of highly skilled nurses, improving staff retention and partnering with health care organizations and facilities.
