Artificial Intelligence

Please refer to the email sent on 1/3/2024 with an update on A.I. at Villanova. Faculty now have access to a secure <u>Microsoft's Copilot</u> chat application which is built off of Open A.I. Information uploaded to Copilot remains private and is not used to train the base model.

Masking

Villanova has revised the masking policy to be consistent with current health care practices. Beginning with the Spring 2024 Semester, Villanova will no longer offer the option to require students to wear masks in classes, laboratories, or offices. The policy will continue to allow anyone who wants to wear masks to do so. Everyone is expected to put Community First and be respectful of others' masking decisions. The reasons why individuals may choose to wear a mask can vary widely, so everyone is expected to show respect in these situations.
