Faculty Colleagues,

I hope everyone had a restful and restorative break. As we look ahead to the spring semester, there is much to be excited about in 2026 from the full launch of Brightspace to the opening of the Villanova Cabrini Campus. Below are a few reminders to help you prepare for the semester ahead:

Blackboard Ends

On June 18, 2026 Blackboard will no longer be accessible and any data in it will be erased. All fall 2025 Blackboard courses will be imported into Brightspace shortly and by early June all spring 2026 courses will also be imported. These will join your previous imports from the summer of 2023 onward. You can log into [Brightspace](#) now to see your imports. If you desire any older courses or organizations to be imported, make the request prior to May 31, 2026 [here](#). Since student data does not transfer you should download any gradebooks or other student items you desire to keep prior to June 18.

Blackboard to Brightspace Conversion

All courses that begin in May 2026 or later will only be taught in Brightspace. If you desire to use any materials from Blackboard, it is highly recommended that you build your new Brightspace course while you still have access to your live Blackboard course (until June 18). Links to third party tools (through LTIs) will be broken, layouts/organization will be different, and there are many more options available that you may wish to explore. You can launch as many Brightspace sandboxes (empty courses) to start using and then copy materials into the live courses before teaching starts. Brightspace Course Design Lab, Spring Recess 2026

Looking for focused time and in-person support to get started in Brightspace? Join us for a two-day, lab-style program designed to help you build your course in Brightspace. The lab combines substantial individual work time with targeted guidance, short demonstrations, and one-on-one assistance from VITAL and UTS colleagues. Whether you are migrating an existing course or designing something new, you will have access to resources, templates, and support throughout the process. Choose from two in-person sessions: March 2-3 or March 4-5, 9:00am-3:00pm. Faculty who will be teaching their in-person course online Summer 2026 are

Textbook Access Program (non Law, EMBA, Grad Tax, or study abroad)

Students in credit-bearing undergraduate and graduate programs, except as noted above, are part of the textbook access program which provides students all of their required course materials for a fixed fee of \$20 per credit in which they are enrolled. Required materials (including the use of Lab Archives for courses) must be entered into the [Barnes and Nobel College \(BNC\) system](#). Students can opt out of the program and purchase materials on their own. Students in the program should only obtain their required materials through the program; please do not ask them to print, purchase, or find materials on their own (unless it is at no cost). If you utilize digital materials for your course(s), the bookstore will email you instructions for how to add them to your Blackboard page so students can access them. Lecture Capture Classrooms

Faculty assigned to [Lecture Capture Capable](#) classrooms outside the Law School, will receive an email prior to the start of the semester with directions on how to select your classes for automatic recordings. These recordings will remain private in the [MyMediasite](#) library of the

lead professor. *Classes will not be automatically recorded. You will need to **opt in** to the recordings.*

Foundational Use of the LMS Requirement

Starting in summer of 2026, all faculty must meet the [foundational use requirements](#) in Brightspace for all their courses. In short, this policy requires that faculty will have their syllabus, use the gradebook, post all digitally available material, and add due dates (using the "Due Date" setting) for assignments, exams, quizzes, readings, and other requirements in Brightspace.
