 This messaging application can be used for messaging and meeting needs. Please note that this will replace the current messaging client Microsoft Office Communicator (MOC client).
Skype for Business is Microsoft's replacement messaging solution for Microsoft Office Communicator, which is no longer supported by Microsoft. Please note that the contact list will need to be recreated.
 Features included: Mobile Skype for Business app; Skype-to-Skype communication audio/video; global address list; screensharing; instant messaging; presence from calendar (will no longer show in call presence); and file transfer.

- **Spam Quarantine Enhancements:**
In February, UNIT rolled out enhancements to the spam services that protect the University Email system. This change streamlined the experience with an improved quarantine interface as well as more robust protection features. In addition to the antivirus and antispam protections from the current system, the new spam services will allow you to protect mailboxes against new, sophisticated attacks in real time by protecting against unsafe attachments and expanding protection against malicious links embedded in email messages.
