Please refer to the mailing label on the back of this booklet for your personalized Orientation Group Information. Bring this information with you to campus so you will know where to meet your Orientation Counselor (OC).

The first line contains the number of your Orientation Group.

The second line contains the location of the meeting place for your Orientation Group, also called your Indoor Designated Reporting Area. The letter(s) stands for the name of the building and the numbers designate the room number in that building.

In the sample label, "Alex Smith" is in Orientation Group #98 and will meet their OC in Bartley Hall, Room 4000. Please take a moment to review the information on your own mailing label on the back of this brochure, as it will tell you where you will meet your OC and group on Saturday, August 20, at 2:05 p.m.

DIRECTIONS TO RESIDENCE HALLS

CAUGHLIN, GOOD COUNSEL, KATHARINE, MCGUIRE AND MORIARTY HALLS:

If traveling from Route 476 (traveling East on Route 30), turn right into Parking Lot L2 via the driveway directly after Farrell Hall. If traveling West on Route 30, turn left into Parking Lot L-2 at St. Thomas Way.

STANFORD AND ST. MONICA HALLS:

If traveling from Route 476 (traveling East on Route 30), travel past St. Thomas Way and the intersection at Ithan Avenue. You will be directed by Public Safety to make a left at Galberry Hall into the A-2 Parking Lot. If traveling West on Route 30, make a right into the A-2 Parking Lot at Galberry Hall.

DELUREY, O'DWYER AND SIMPSON HALLS:

Enter at the Delurey Gate entrance on Spring Mill Road/Route 320.

ALUMNI AND FEDIGAN HALLS:

Enter at the Fedigan Gate entrance on Spring Mill Road/Route 320.

ST. MARY'S HALL:

Enter at the West Campus Gate entrance on Spring Mill Road/Route 320.

IMPORTANT TIP: Please display your hang tag from your rear view mirror as you enter the campus vicinity.

SPECIAL ACCOMMODATIONS

The University Welcome and Opening Mass on Saturday, August 20, will be held on the Rowen Campus Green. Due to traffic congestion, campus visitors will not be allowed to park on Main Campus. If you or a family member require special accommodations for these events, please contact the Dean of Students Office at 610-519-4200 prior to your arrival.



FRIDAY, AUGUST 19

On **MOVE-IN DAY**, we anticipate an increased amount of traffic and waiting periods as we facilitate check-in for 1,800 new students. To expedite this process, all incoming first-year residential students register for a move-in time via a unique link that was sent to your villanova.edu email address. Students select a 30-minute window to move in between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. according to your assigned residence hall. Additionally, students are able to edit and adjust arrival times using the unique link based on availability before Move-In Day, if needed.

HANG TAG

Students will receive a mailing from the Office of Residence Life that contains helpful information regarding coming to campus for move-in, including a hang tag for your vehicle. Please detach and display this hang tag from your rear-view mirror. Only vehicles displaying this hang tag will be permitted to access areas near residence halls.

MOVE-IN PROCESS

- When you arrive at your residence hall, please unload your belongings. You will then be directed to move your car to a campus parking lot.
- Parents and family members will not be allowed to park their cars and leave them unattended in front of residence halls as this causes major traffic congestion and lengthy delays.
- •After you unload your belongings, check-in and pick up your Wildcard at the entrance to your residence hall. Your Wildcard will allow you access to both your residence hall and your room.
- Please label your bags/items with your name, residence hall and room number.
- Please dispose of your recycling and trash according to the posted signs outside your building.
- Residence Life and Orientation staff will be available at your hall to assist you and answer questions.
- During move-in, listen to Villanova Radio, 89.1 FM WXVU.
 They will be broadcasting live and providing important updates and Orientation information.
- **Donahue and Dougherty Dining Halls** will offer lunch for \$5 per person from noon–4 p.m. Several á la carte operations will also be open on Main and West Campuses.


